First Reading Luke 4:14-21

¹⁴ Then Jesus, filled with the power of the Spirit, returned to Galilee, and a report about him spread through all the surrounding country. ¹⁵ He began to teach in their synagogues and was praised by everyone.

When he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, he went to the synagogue on the sabbath day, as was his custom. He stood up to read, 17 and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written:

18 "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me,

because he has anointed me

to bring good news to the poor.

He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives

and recovery of sight to the blind,

to let the oppressed go free,

19 to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."

They said, "Is not this Joseph's son?" 23 He said to them, "Doubtless you will quote to me this proverb, 'Doctor, cure yourself!' And you will say, 'Do here also in your hometown the things that we have heard you did at Capernaum." 24 And he said, "Truly I tell you, no prophet is accepted in the prophet's hometown. 25 But the truth is, there were many widows in Israel in the time of Elijah, when the heaven was shut up three years and six months, and there was a severe famine over all the land; 26 yet Elijah was sent to none of them except to a widow at Zarephath in Sidon. 27 There were also many lepers in Israel in the time of the prophet Elisha, and none of them was cleansed except Naaman the Syrian." 28 When they heard this, all in the synagogue were filled with rage. 29 They got up, drove him out of the town, and led him to the brow of the hill on which their town was built, so that they might hurl him off the cliff. 30 But he passed through the midst of them and went on his way.

Per Capita Sunday

January 23rd has been designated as Per Capita Sunday by the PC(USA). You probably remember seeing notices about Per Capita in prior years and may have wondered what it is all about. Of course "per capita" literally means "per head" or "for each person," but in the PC(USA) Per Capita is the primary means of sharing the costs of being the church at the presbytery, synod, and General Assembly levels.

The purpose of the presbytery and the higher councils is to help congregations and the church as a whole in their work of mission, ministry, and transformation of the world (Book of Order F-3.01). The presbytery is a community of congregations supporting each other in mission and ministry. Per Capita is the financial expression of mutual support for each congregation's work. As we are singing

in our opening hymn, "Blest be the tie that binds" us all together

Each mid-council sets a per capita rate, which is assessed based on the membership of each member congregation. The 2022 per capita rate for members of the Presbytery of the Highlands of New Jersey is \$40, of which the majority goes to the presbytery, with smaller amounts to the Synod of the Northeast and the General Assembly. The 2022 amount for our congregation is \$6,640, which we include in the Administration portion of our budget.

We encourage each member to make an additional donation of the Per Capita amount of \$40 as part of their giving to the Presbyterian Church of Madison.

Navigating Hope is inspired by the Morris County Sheriff's Hope One Mobile Addiction and Recovery vehicle and is a partnership between Morris County Human Services and Family Promise of Morris County. They utilize a van to provide case management, advocacy, and a variety of services, including benefits eligibility screenings and application assistance for low-income and homeless individuals. The van travels across Morris County,
